Ports & Logistics Overview

Ports have, throughout history, been a place where goods and people arrive or leave the country by sea. **Logistics** is the management, movement & storage of products. It is about getting the right product to the right place, at the right time. It is also about the movement of people by road, rail, sea and air. It includes postal and courier services. Large companies such as supermarkets run their own logistics while other companies outsource all their logistics to specialist companies.

Did you know?

- The Ports & Logistics Sector accounts for 6.5% of the region's workforce, employing 22,944 people
- 1 in 12 people working in the UK are working in logistics related industries. Incredibly that's 2.3 million people spanning some 196,000 companies
- Only 36% of the workforce are under 34
- The Humber is the UK's busiest trading estuary and the 5th busiest in Europe
- Around 1 million P&O Ferries passengers pass through the port of Hull each year
- The Ports of Grimsby and Immingham are the UK's largest ports by tonnage
- Logistics is not just about driving - there are a variety of occupations within the industry

Will there be opportunities available?

- The sector is set to continue to grow in the Humber Sub-Region as a result of the investment in the Energy and Renewable Sector
- Employment in the logistics sector is expected to grow by 16% by 2020 nationally
- Ports & Logistics sector is identified as one of our key growth sectors accounting for 17.5% of the UK's maritime trade and supporting around 47,000 jobs in the region.
- The supply of both deck and engine officers is projected to fall by more than 30 per cent nationally
